gli avverbi di frequenza si usano per dire quanto spesso si compie un'azione

Compare

* a differenza dell'italiano **'mai'**,
l'avverbio **never** (non ... mai)
si usa in frase con il verbo
affermativo con senso negativo.

Non guardo **mai** la TV.
I **never** watch TV.

always	sempre
usually	di solito
often	spesso
sometimes	delle volte qualche volta
never	mai
seldom	ogni tanto
rarely	raramente
hardly ever	quasi mai
ever *	mai * (nelle frasi interrogative)
generally	generalmente

gli avverbi di frequenza di solito
vengono posti tra il soggetto e il verbo

soggetto + avverbio di frequenza + verbo + ...

I always play rugby.
Anna never walks home.

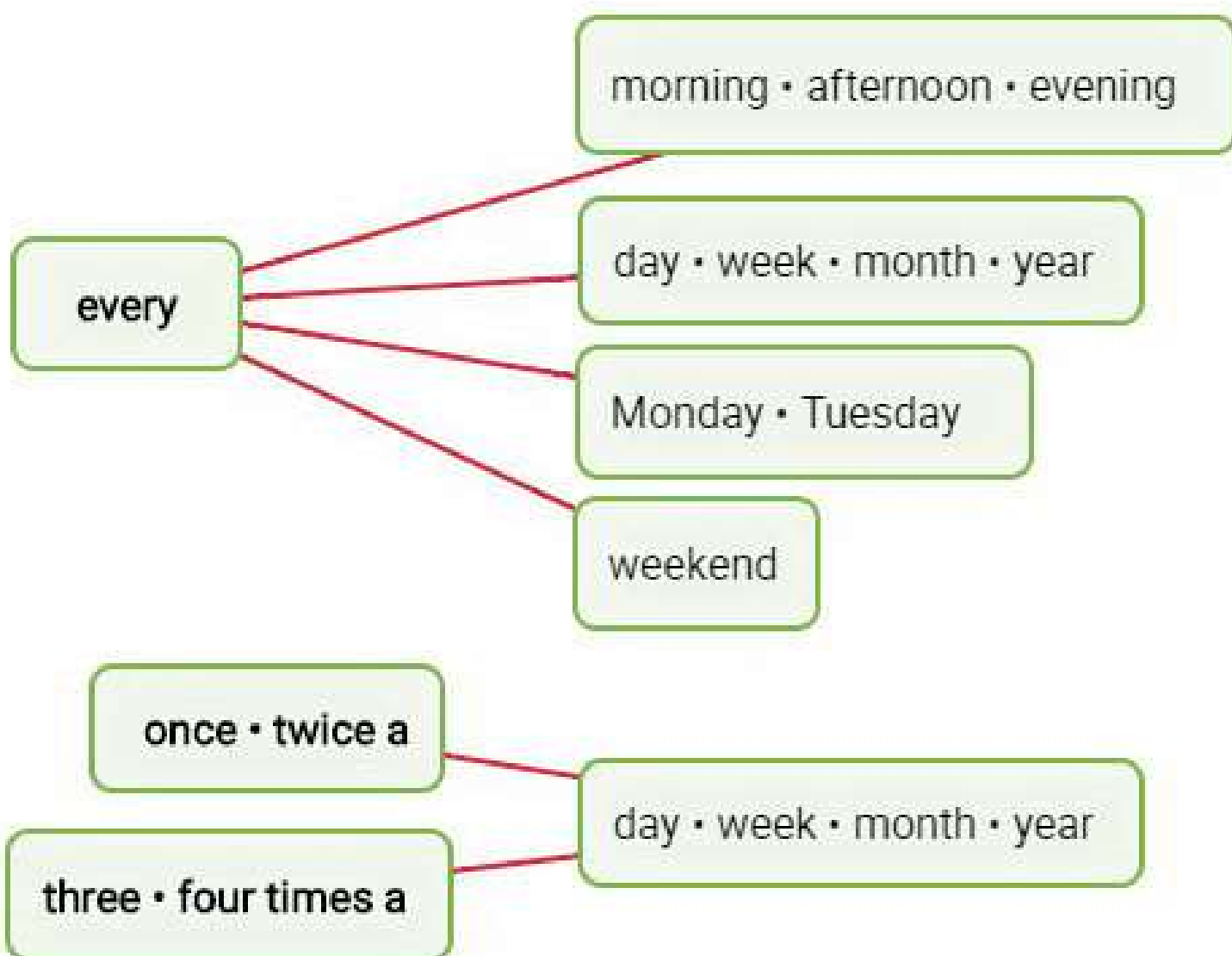
Ma con **be** gli avverbi di frequenza
vengono **posti dopo il verbo**

soggetto + **be** + avverbio di frequenza

We are often late.

I look in your room **every morning**.

We watch films **twice a week**.



Le espressioni di frequenza si posizionano di solito alla fine della frase.

- Alcuni come **usually** e **often** si possono mettere anche a **INIZIO FRASE**

Adverbs

The words that affect the meaning of a verb, an adjective or another adverb in terms of time, place, measure, quality, question are called the **adverb**.
